

Senior Musical Theatre- Monologue Choices BOYS

1.) *In this male teen monologue, RON talks to Cher, who he thought was a good friend of his but has been acting shady whenever she is in front of her "other" friends.*

RON: I know I'm eccentric but that doesn't mean I'm crazy, does it? I'm a little quirky and rough around the edges but it doesn't mean I'm not all there mentally. You shouldn't judge me based on what people say about me and letting them fool you into thinking I'm weird and strange when you've gotten to know me. You shouldn't be embarrassed hanging out with me or talking to me in front of your other friends. I thought you were better than that. But if you want to pretend and act like we were never really cool with one another because it's uncool to be seen with me around school, then fine, do what you need to do and go hang out with your other peeps. I don't need a friend like you anyway.

2.) *In this comedy monologue, BART tells his friend all about this date he had with a girl who came off as someone way beyond his own intelligence.*

Bart: I can't believe...no, just can't believe she told me I have no depth. Depth? I have depth. I'm a very, very deep guy, okay? I mean, I know things, alright. Depth...pfff! Depth is my middle name...okay, so I haven't traveled as much but still, I have had experiences...depth...

She told me I am not enough of a conversationalist for her, that she needs to have a higher level of talk. She said I am too dimwitted for her. I am not a dimwit okay...I have wit, I am a pretty witty guy, right?

I make people laugh all the time and I am a good thinker. I think alone, outloud sometimes...like I---man, she was talking about things I never even heard of before. She was so fascinating. Like, I didn't have a freaking clue what she was saying but she sounded so smart that I got totally mesmerized. I'm such a tool, man. Damn.

She was going on about space and the planets and in the next breath she jumped over to economics and the stock market, before spinning me into ancient Egyptian culture and architecture and mystery and I couldn't say anything. I had absolutely *nothing*. Nothing to add to the conversation. My mind went blank. I think I tried talking about ghosts or something but by that point it was like, "Whaaat?"

3.) *In this monologue, We Would Have Had A Lot In Common, Jacob talks about wishing he had known his Grandfather as an adult.*

For some reason I was thinking about him. He died when I was a kid, so I never really got a chance to get to know him...I have a few memories of him though.

4.) *Fired Up is a teen guy monologue, BRYAN confronts a friend about how he found out he was talking trash behind his back and now their friendship is done.*

Bryan: I'm so angry with you right now, bro. I thought we were tight and instead you're talking rubbish behind my back. All this time I thought we were boys and you went behind my back.

Jessica told me what you said man and I know she isn't lying, so that kills our friendship flat. You can't go behind someone's back and say the things you said thinking it's all good.

(beat)

Doesn't matter what you say now dog, we ain't down like that no more and I guess we never were anyway if you were talking all that smack.

Yo, I don't want to hear from you no more man. I'm letting you off easy right now you understand me? Don't hit me up no more or I will bust your jaw line next time I see you.
